



Microsoft Excel unspecified code execution

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ms-excel-unspecified-code-execution (48875) **reported Feb 23, 2009**

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Microsoft Excel could allow a remote attacker to execute arbitrary code on the system, caused by the improper parsing of Excel spreadsheets. By persuading a victim to open a specially crafted Excel spreadsheet, a remote attacker could exploit this vulnerability to corrupt memory and execute arbitrary code on the system with the privileges of the victim.

Consequences:

Gain Access

Remedy

Apply the appropriate patch for your system, as listed in the latest Microsoft Security Bulletin. See References.
